

Our trip to London - Bilifahrt 8B - 29/09/ - 05/10/2019

Of course, we took a lot of cool photos of typical British things, places and sights. We saw Buckingham Palace, St. James's Park and visited the Museum of London. The museum was gigantic and there were so many historical things to see and the souvenir shop sold many interesting gifts.

For our way back to the city we took a boat. It was interesting to see how many people use the boat as public transport and going underneath the Tower Bridge by boat was amazing!






